Report	commemorate guide dogs. The Chair is the Board's first with a guide dog. The Chair indicated that	
	service animals were first substantively included in the law of the Fair Housing Amendments Act of	
	1988, which preceded the ADA. In lieu of a more extensive set of remarks by the Chair, the Board,	
	with executive staff present, received a briefing by Angela Fox, Esq. a lawyer with a disability and	
	subject matter expert on fair housing and disability. She educated the Board and the staff on the	
	importance of fair housing for persons with disabilities, and how a lot of the financing of	
	modifications for homes and household related costs tends to be focused on non-working persons	
	with disabilities, as opposed to working professionals with disabilities. She emphasized the	
	importance of the Able Act and its implementation in Maryland as one remedy or tool. Ostensibly,	
	she discussed the need to continue to combat discrimination against people with disabilities in fair	
	housing. As she and the Chair have discussed, in some ways, there is a kind of "red lining" that	
	happens with people with disabilities either because of poverty or the nature of communities to meet	
	the needs of working professionals with disabilities who will have a variety of accessibility	
	demands to be acitive members. She stressed the need to work with the real estate industry and	
	with home contractors in modifying homes, and in financing such modifications, actively. She	
	discussed actionable deliverables for the Board. She requests that the Chair work with stakeholders,	
	such as with Maryland Department of Disabilities.
